A collaboration between visual artist Yannick Moréteau and electronic music composer Flore, Sensitive Abstraction is an artistic performance that explores the relationship between the arts and mathematics.

Conceived as a stroll through different graphic and sound environments, Sensitive Abstraction is a full-dome immersive creation accompanied by a spatial soundtrack.




Like a synaesthetic saunter through a series of moving tableaux, in turn minimalist, figurative, surrealist and playful, Sensitive Abstraction reveals and questions the influence of major mathematical concepts in the field of music and the arts, revealing their poetry, their tangible manifestations and their aesthetic modernity.

Sensitive Abstraction blends technological innovation and poetry to create a captivating immersive experience. The images, carefully designed using generative graphic tools, come to life by **interacting with sound waves manipulated in real time**. This to-and-fro between image and sound has been **nurtured by numerous exchanges with mathematicians**, enabling a live interpretation that is both free and faithful to the mathematical subject.


Long used as a tool for composing or analysing works of art, mathematics has become one of the most exciting creative subjects of the 20th century.

Vasarely, Escher, Le Corbusier, Philippe Leblanc, Kandinsky - there are many artists who work with, borrow from or refer to mathematics in their work. In music, this filiation is everywhere and forms the basis of music as we practise it today (harmony, solfeggio, rhythmic patterns, etc.). This method has also become a compositional tool in its own right, for composers such as Steve Reich and Brian Eno. It was this very aspect that excited Flore, and was the starting point for this new collaboration with Yannick Moréteau.



**Founder of the WSK collective**, a pioneering structure in the field of vjing in France, **Yannick Moréteau is a** product of DIY culture. His graphic identity is characterised by a fascination with abstraction, starting with a simple element which, through accumulation, movement and distortion, is transformed into a moving texture, a symbolic form far removed from its original appearance.

Since 2007, Yannick has been honing his skills in immersive and monumental creation, from generative video animation to 3D mapping of architectural heritage, and scenic design for live performance.

His collaboration with electronic music composer Flore began in 2013. Together they created a live audiovisual show entitled "RITUALS". Initially designed for **360° broadcast on 4 projection walls** (residency at the Chateau Ephémère followed by a performance at the Gaité Lyrique), this live show will be presented in a **dome version at** the Ateliers Eclairés (Strasbourg) in 2021.

In 2024, Yannick Moréteau and WSK are investing in a travelling dome to broadcast and produce immersive works.

Driven by risk-taking and insatiable curiosity, Flore is one of the leading artists on the French electronic music scene, having anticipated all its developments over the last two decades.

Passionate about technology - which she sees as an ally in imagining new ways of composing music - Flore was involved from an early age in developing new aesthetics and new scenic devices. Over the last few years, she has worked closely with visual artist WSK on the conception of live performances combining music and immersive video mapping (360 video, dome), while taking a growing interest in spatial broadcasting. She has been invited to play an immersive live set on 158 loudspeakers at the SAT (Société des Arts Technologiques de Montréal), and to play in quadraphony with 3 other musicians (Maelstrom, Djedjotronics & Fasme) in an '8-handed performance' at the Scopitone festival at Stéréolux in 2022.

It's partly this expertise that has seen her frequently invited to take part in a host of projects, including the live 'inBach' with musician Arandel (inFiné) and a joint creation with the Musée de la Musique's collection of rare and precious instruments. All these ingredients make Flore a real creative force on the European music scene.
