Artistic intent

asklipion is an art installation project aimed at raising awareness about medicinal plants. It is a light, sound and plant installation, visible by **night and day**, that talks about alternative medicine and helps to tell which plant brings which benefit to the body.


In Greco-Roman antiquity, an *asklipion* is a sanctuary of healing, dedicated to Asklipios. In the Homeric epic Asklipios is the god of medicine. Son of Apollo, he is the mythical ancestor of the Asklipiades, a dynasty of physicians practicing in Cos and Knidos, of which Hippocrates is the most illustrious member.

Halfway between the Greek temple from which the work takes its name, an apothecary's stall and an open-air exhibition wall, askliption consists of 120 lamps housing frozen plants magnified by light and music.

Concretely, *asklipion* translates plants into light and sound. The work offers the viewer a soothing, almost therapeutic experience. Its light and sound programming is constructed in harmony with the medicinal properties of each plant. Relaxing, it recalls the processes of light therapy and music therapy. Labels will allow the spectators to identify each plant and its properties.

The musical creation of Cédric Béron is thought to relax, inspired by the study of David Lewis-Hodgson, a neuropsychiatrist whose study has demonstrated the power of music to reduce anxiety. The colors, sources of energy combined with the soothing power of music and the virtues of plants, immerse the viewer in a harmonious and rejuvenating universe.


asklipion is an ode to nature, a haven of peace in the bustle of the city.



SYMBIOSIS WITH NATURE

With this artwork, Emilien suggests to listen and understand nature again. If human beings manage to be more connected and careful with the environment, the whole world would benefit. In a way, asklipion is a proposal for a better life, **in symbiosis with nature**.





Approach

Echoing the current ecological context which questions the link between man and plants, the *asklipion* project was born in Emilien's head during a walk in the forest. He started from the observation that we do not really transmit the knowledge related to the plants that surround us. He thus had the idea of creating a work to recreate the conditions of this transmission. He solicited the **illustrator and herbalist** Claire Lebeau to make first tests of integration of plants in a luminous and sound device (see the photos opposite and below).

In a second step, he asked his friend and **biologist** Emeline Mourocq to explore different techniques allowing to **retranscribe the frequency produced by plants dried in their natural state through sound and light.**

Several plants will be tested. During these tests, the frequencies they will generate will allow to imagine light and music. In the end, *asklipion* is a mixture of aesthetics, medicinal properties and sound frequencies.

An experience both dirune and nocturnal

BY DAY

A soothing, educational experience. Daylight reveals the natural colors of each plant. The public can contemplate the whole and read a discreet label on each lamp to identify the plants. A pannel put next to the installation explains the benefits of each plant.

BY NIGHT

The frequencies produced by the plants are translated into a loop of light and sound, bringing the whole installation to life. Inspired by light therapy and music therapy, this visual and sound track offers a moment of relaxation. The labels can also be read at night, keeping the pedagogical dimension of the work.





Emilien Guesnard is a visual artist and lighting designer based in the Monts du Lyonnais next to Lyon in France. He creates light and sound installations for public spaces that question the world and its changes. He blends light in all its forms with haunting sounds that project our imaginations into other worlds. In addition to making it his profession, light has been a veritable means of expression for him since childhood. Between exhibitions, concerts and his wanderings around festivals, the artist experiments with this intangible material that he tames and shapes, no longer as a showcase, but as the main actor in his creations.

Claire Lebeau is an artist from Lyon who presents plant and dreamlike works through floating sculptures under a globe and pencil drawings that seem to come straight out of a cabinet of curiosities. Her work is strongly influenced by her love of scientific illustration, flora and fauna and the notion of beauty.

Her intuitive creations, like small jewel cases crystallized in time, metaphorically link the animal and plant world to human nature. Pôlette - service de l'AADN Administration



Structure: 4,5 m x 4,5 m / height : 4 m

Two structure options :

closed structure with water fountain on a closed loop at the heart of the installation.
open structure: the public can go inside (no fountain)

Surface required: 8m diameter

Light: 120 marine lamps adapted with RGB LED lights

Sound system: on top of the structure and one sub inside

Transparency: the view crosses the artwork

Visibility: by day and by night

Environnement: outdoor or indoor

Power: 1 x PC16

Weight: 330 kg

Mediation: plant identification labels on lamps and explanatory panel (aluminum dibond) positioned next to the installation


